






Installation


- □ Self-installable
- Compatible with the different joysticks
- Does not interfere with the wheelchair's electronics (based on accelerometers)








Personalisation



- BJOY Ring can be configured on start-up and all the parameters are saved to the device.
- The device is calibrated and adjusts to the user's position and movements.



Personalisation



- Clicking can be done with external switches or by dwell click (without requiring software).
- Provides ways for doubleclicking, right-button clicking, drag&drop, scroll, etc.



Two versions available

BJOY Ring (wired)

 Ideal for controlling devices installed in the wheelchair itself.

BJOY Ring Wireless

 Ideal for controlling elements that are not in the wheelchair or many devices at the same time.

□ Scenario 2: Nearby devices



Toggle between devices with a single **gesture** (making a circle with the wheelchair's joystick) or clicking on the external switch.

Scenarios 1 and 2 can be combined for up to a total of four devices.


Wireless version
